Virginia's February County and Area Employment Figures Released

RICHMOND— Virginia Works (the Department of Workforce Development and Advancement) announced today the release of preliminary February 2025 and revised January 2025 county and area employment figures. These figures are not seasonally adjusted. Among the counties and city equivalents¹, Highland County had the lowest unemployment rate in February at 2.5 percent, while Emporia city had the highest at 7.9 percent.

Among the metro areas, Charlottesville and Staunton-Stuarts Draft had the lowest unemployment rates in February at 2.9 percent, while Blacksburg-Christiansburg-Radford had the highest at 4.1 percent. The not seasonally adjusted statewide rate was 3.3 percent, which is 1.2 points lower than the not seasonally adjusted national rate of 4.5 percent. The statistical reference week for the household survey this month was the week of February 9-15, 2025.

The March 2025 statewide unemployment rate and employment data for both the state and metropolitan areas are scheduled to be released on Friday, April 18, 2025. The data will be available at www.VirginiaWorks.com. The Virginia Department of Workforce Development and Advancement plans to release the March 2025 local area unemployment rates on Tuesday, April 29, 2025.

Please note that sub-state data for prior years is still under review by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, with final revisions scheduled for publication on April 18, 2025. As a result, year-over-year comparisons, the "Top 5 Counties and Cities by Employment Growth Rate" graph, and the "Employment Growth Rate" by Virginia counties map will not be available for the January and February 2025 data releases. These visuals will be provided with the March 2025 data release.
